### Poster Submission Information

We invite submissions of extended abstracts for posters related to the conference topics of software engineering education and training. Posters may present late-breaking research results, on-going or future research projects, training experience, or innovative work in progress.

Please submit an extended abstract of the presented contribution comprising the following contents:

- Title
- Author(s) and affiliation(s)
- Motivation and goals
- Background information if needed to understand the contribution
- Adequate detail on the contribution
- Related work
- Links to additional information (e.g., project Website, source code repository, demo material, etc.)

The extended abstract should be written in English, adhere to the IEEE formatting instructions and is restricted to two pages. Poster abstracts must be submitted electronically through EasyChair. The detailed submission guidelines for all submission categories are available at: <http://conferences.computer.org/cseet/2020>.

For each accepted poster, as least one author must register for the conference by May 9, 2020. After registration, each accepted poster abstract will be published in the proceedings.

The poster should to be in A1 (594mm x 841mm) or A0 (841mm x 1189mm) portrait format. The article [Research posters 101](#) by Lorrie Faith Cranor published in ACM Crossroads provides excellent tips on how to prepare successful posters.
